

(Lure Course Rules)

Fees/Membership

- 1. No membership fees
- 2. All breeds and mixed breeds welcome
- 3. The event host will send \$5 (US) per dog that competes in each event to the UPF. Hosts may not charge more than \$20 (US) per dog.

Eligibility

- 1. All dogs competing for qualifying legs and points must be 36 weeks of age
- 2. Dogs can wear any collar or harness, other than a prong or choke chain. Flat buckle collar preferred
- 3. All dogs must be kept in a safe/secure crate
- 4. Bait may be used at the end of the lure to out the dog off the lure string.
- 5. All dogs must be on 4' lead when not in crate or competing
- 6. No females in heat will be allowed to compete or be present at show site
- 7. No human/dog aggressive dogs will be allowed at the show site
- 8. Animal abuse will not be tolerated. This includes physical or verbal abuse. The chief judge reserves the right to disqualify (DQ) a handler for abuse
- 9. The chief judge will determine if a dog is injured or too thin to participate before event starts
- 10. Muzzles are allowed to keep the dog from biting the string
- 11. NO Alcohol or drug use permitted at any UPF event

Lure Procedures

- 1. Lure course will be no shorter than 200ft and no more than 300ft
- 2. All dogs will get TWO runs and the fastest of the two will be the run used for determining placement. Dogs will run both of their runs back-to-back
- 3. Dogs will start in the start box, pre-determined by the judge

As of: December 2, 2025

- 4. An electronic timer (preferred) or stopwatch may be used to judge the time
- 5. There are no height or weight classes
- 6. Judge will decide the run order before the event and make sure, when possible, that handlers with multiple dogs are not running back-to-back
- 7. Any dog that relieves itself on the lure course will be DQ'd
- 8. Absolutely no performance enhancing drugs. The UPF will have a drug test conducted by a licensed yet

Handlers

1. A catcher and a releaser is required (bring a second leash) anyone can catch or release a dog

Point System

1st place 10 points 2nd place 7 points 3rd place 5 points

Add 1 additional point for every dog they beat

Nationals

- 1. To be eligible to compete, a dog must compete in 5 events to qualify for nationals
 - a. If your dog cannot complete 5 events buy-ins at nationals will be available. Cost is \$5 x the number of events needed to meet eligibility requirements. Example if your dog competed in 3 events cost to buy-in would be \$10 plus cost of nationals entry fee
- 2. All titles earned during season will be handed out at nationals

Equipment

- 1. Lure machine
- 2. String, pullies, bag
- 3. Electronic timers or stopwatch (requires two ppl)

Sanctioning

- 1. Show season is 11/1 thru 9/30. Shows may be sanctioned outside of these dates but do not count towards qualifying for nationals
- 2. All events must be sanctioned 30 days before event

As of: December 2, 2025

- 3. Events can be scheduled any day of the week (Monday Sunday). No limit on the number of sprints scheduled per event
- 4. NO Alcohol or drug use permitted at any UPF event
- 5. A list of sanctioned judges is available on the UPF website
- 6. Entry forms, result, score and summary sheets must be sent to the webmistress apbtme2@gmail.com; per dog fees must be sent to the treasurer through PayPal (using 'send to a friend' feature) within 10 days of conclusion of event. Email for PayPal is karenpearce.upf@gmail.com
- 7. Paperwork and per dog fees for events sanctioned in September MUST be received within 24 hours of event weekend
- 8. Paperwork and per dog fees received late incur a \$50 late charge

Judges

1. To become a sanctioned lure course judge, you must apprentice 4 events under a senior judge
